

## **The Who's Who of Tombstone**

### **Townfolk**

#### ***Mayor Lawrence Murphy***

*Wealthy businessman and town mayor*

Lawrence Murphy owns the Tombstone Bank and Murphy's General Store, the main store in town. As the currently elected mayor he chairs the Town Council. Mayor Murphy is the driving force behind the Poker Championship as a way to promote Tombstone. He's also a noted player and so likely to take part.

#### ***Judge Roy Bean***

*Eccentric Territory judge*

Judge Roy Bean is the man responsible for trying all legal cases in the county. He's eccentric, frequently imposing unusual sentences. He used to hold court sessions in his own saloon, the Jersey Lily, but that burnt down recently. As Tombstone lacks a dedicated courthouse, he'll need to find a new venue. Judge Bean is also responsible for approving all liquor, gambling and entertainment licence requests. As Tombstone's Judge, Bean also sits on the Town Council.

#### ***Sheriff Washington Dimsdale***

*Drunkard town sheriff*

When the last sheriff, Will Kane, had to leave town suddenly a few weeks back it was Washington Dimsdale, one of the town drunkards, who somehow ended up appointed to replace him. Although hardly anybody takes him seriously, Dimsdale has tried his best and sometimes keeps off the liquor. He's even hired Tom Destry Jnr, son of the lawman who cleaned up Deadwood, as his deputy. The town is holding elections for a proper sheriff this weekend, so Dimsdale will probably be back in the gutter soon. In the meantime, Dimsdale has jurisdiction within the town limits and holds the Town Sheriff's seat on the Town Council.

#### ***Sheriff Bill Cobb***

*County Sheriff*

Bill Cobb is sheriff of Cochise County, with jurisdiction for the whole county outside the Tombstone town limits. Cobb is a tough man who fought in the Civil War and came to Tombstone about three years ago. He's been county sheriff ever since then and has generally managed to keep trouble to a minimum. That is, until the Cowboy Gang arrived.

#### ***Preacher Elijah Cort***

*Town preacher*

Preacher Cort is the town's pastor, arriving in Tombstone to preach a couple of years ago. He holds his Sunday services in one of the saloons, as there's no church in Tombstone yet. He is outspoken against violence of all kinds and regularly preaches how good Christians should turn the other cheek to such as the Cowboys. Cort is also a member of the Town Council, holding the post of Treasurer.

#### ***Doctor Frederick Hostetler***

*Established local doctor*

Old Doc Hostetler is the town's long-established doctor, who arrived at the time the town was founded. He is a member of the Town Council and also doubles up as the town assayer, valuing silver and gold finds. Doc is the man most of the older townfolk and ranchers call upon when they're sick.

#### ***Doctor Michaela Quinn***

*Idealistic new doctor*

Doctor Quinn, from Boston, is one of the first women to have qualified as a medical doctor in the country. She arrived in Tombstone a few months ago to set up her practice and is now in competition with Doc Hostetler. Doctor Quinn is increasingly popular with the younger folk of the area, especially the women, and also frequently visits the nearby Indian reservation. She has also just been appointed to the Town Council alongside her rival.

#### ***Hezekiah Beckum***

*Town undertaker and councillor*

Old man Beckum is the town undertaker and the brother-in-law of Frank J. Cooper, the Governor of Arizona Territory. He's also a town councillor and the appointed Election Officer – the man responsible for running the upcoming votes for a new Town Sheriff and Town Councillor. These jobs would all keep him pretty busy even if the Cowboys and others weren't providing him with regular business in his main profession. Beckum has just got back to town on the train after a few days visiting his brother.

***'Calamity' Jane Canary***

***Celebrated Indian scout***

Calamity Jane has lived in Tombstone for the past few years but as an Indian scout, rider and sharpshooter, she's often away around the territory. Always dressed in men's clothing, Calamity has a reputation as an eccentric, although few people comment. She is, after all, one of the fastest guns in the West and can outride all but a very few men. Calamity has been away for a couple of days, but just got back to town on the train with Adelaide Adams.

***Cheyenne***

***Half-Indian outlaw***

The half-Indian Cheyenne leads his own small gang, identifiable by the long duster coats they wear. They operate in and around the Territory and are rumoured to be involved in rustling as well as bank and train robberies. Cheyenne is just out of a short spell in prison, sent there for a bungled bank robbery. He tried to hold up a local bank on his own, while apparently drunk and with nothing more than an old boot as a weapon.

***'Frenchy' LeDoux***

***Vivacious saloonkeeper***

Frenchy owns and manages the Last Chance saloon, and sometimes sings to entertain her customers. She's originally from Europe, via New Orleans, and brings glamour to Tombstone. Many townsmen would love to receive her invitation to "Come up and see me sometime".

***Jack Crabb***

***Barman and jack-of-all-trades***

This young man has been around Tombstone on and off since it was founded – although nobody seems to know where he's from. He travels around a great deal and is often away from town for long periods. When he's around he usually helps out in the saloons to earn his keep – he certainly always seems to know a lot about what's going on.

***John Clum***

***Lawyer and newspaper owner***

Owner, publisher and editor of the Tombstone *Epitaph*, John Clum is the area's resident newspaperman, as well as a member of the Town Council. He's also a lawyer who trained in New York before heading out West. Clum came to Tombstone a few years ago from Dodge City and is one of the loudest anti-Cowboy voices in town.

***Julie Maragon***

***Beloved town schoolteacher***

Julie Maragon is the town schoolteacher and is beloved by all the children of Tombstone and around. She's also owner of the Big Muddy ranch, after the death of her father years ago. However the Big Muddy land is empty and she never visits the decaying ranch house, instead living in her cottage in town near the former feed store where she holds her classes. Miss Maragon is a member of the Town Council.

***Lily Laronette***

***Lively saloon girl***

A vivacious and pretty young saloon girl who frequents all the local watering holes. Apparently, she travels quite a bit, as she's often not seen around town.

***Rae Johnson***

***Bar girl and writer***

Rae Johnson was born in Boston but moved to the territory when her family came out here to ranch. She didn't stick the life long and ended up in town a few years ago working at the saloons. As well as entertaining saloon customers, Rae works as one of the main writers for the Tombstone *Epitaph*. However, after the murder of her father last month, she was expected to inherit the Johnson ranch – until her brother Malachi arrived in town.

***Stella Marks***

***Friendly saloonkeeper***

Stella runs the Oriental saloon and as such will host the Poker Championship over the weekend. She's a respected local figure who knows a great deal about what's going on and is a member of the Town Council. Stella has been in Tombstone since it was founded having moved here from Abilene.

***Kit Shelleen***

***Town drunkard***

Kit Shelleen likes to say he lives to drink and drinks to live. He's been Tombstone's resident drunk for about three years. When sober he's a helpful hand, willing to do odd jobs for a dollar or two so he can afford that night's liquor. When drunk he's often pretty entertaining and seldom causes trouble. In the evenings he's usually found in one of the saloons – at the bar or under a table.

## **Ranchers**

### ***John Chisum***

***Dominant ranch owner***

Chisum was the first settler in the area, arriving more than twenty years ago. He now owns the largest and most successful ranch and is a pillar of the community. Chisum, helped by his foreman Ike Clanton, runs his ranch very efficiently. Little is known about Chisum before he came to the area. He's old enough to have fought in the War and certainly seems a tough character.

### ***Jessica Drummond***

***Widowed ranch owner***

The Drummond matriarch has run her family's ranch, along with foreman Sherman McMasters, since her husband was killed. The Drummonds are great enemies of the Terrills, constantly vying to have the better ranch or more success in town affairs. Jessica is rumoured to be organising a private, high-stakes poker game sometime over the weekend.

### ***Brock Drummond***

***Playboy ranch heir***

Young Brock runs the Drummond ranch with his mother Jessica and their foreman Sherman McMasters. He travels around the territory and beyond a fair amount and is considered quite a playboy. He's not the hard-working, god-fearing rancher his father was but is a good rider and supposed to be quite a card-player, as well as a ladies' man.

### ***Jill McBain***

***Widowed rancher***

Mrs McBain arrived in Tombstone two months ago to join her husband on his ranch. They'd met in Kansas City and married just a few months before. He had returned to his ranch and children (he was a widower) and she came out to join him as soon as she tidied up her affairs. But she arrived only hours after McBain and his two young children were found murdered at the ranch. Since that time, Jill has tried to run the small, ill-favoured McBain ranch herself. She's been helped for the last month by the mysterious man she calls 'Preacher', who seems an able hand.

### ***Major Charles Terrill***

***Ex-military ranch owner***

Major Terrill is a wealthy widower who settled in the area with his family about fifteen years ago. He was a successful officer in the Union Army during the Civil War. This is why he still holds the title of Major, although he's now retired. Major Terrill is respected by just about everybody save his great enemies the Drummonds. He's sponsoring a Tombstone horse race as part of the weekend festivities.

### ***Patricia Terrill***

***Beautiful ranch heiress***

The beautiful daughter and heir, of Major Terrill is fun-loving and headstrong. Being brought up on her father's ranch has made her an excellent horsewoman, but she's also been well-educated by expensive tutors. She spent much of last year visiting relatives out East and came back engaged to be married. Her fiancé, Jim McKay, has just arrived in town, ready for the big wedding on Sunday. It should be a grand affair.

### ***Steve Leech***

***Terrill ranch foreman***

The taciturn Steve Leech has been foreman of the Terrill Ranch for the past three years and helps keep it one of the best in the Territory.

### ***Henry Tunstall***

***Seasoned rancher***

Henry Tunstall is the second-longest established rancher in the area after John Chisum, although both the Terrills and the Drummonds have overtaken his ranch in size. Tunstall's ranch is close to the Indian reservation and he maintains good ties with them. He doesn't come to town often, although no doubt this weekend will be an exception what with the County Fair, the Poker Championship and the horse race. Tunstall recently hired Virgil Earp as his ranch foreman.

## **Indians**

### ***Little Big Man***

***Indian tribesman***

The Cherokee brave Little Big Man is a quiet-spoken and traditional young member of the tribe. He comes to town on occasion, often with Speaks With Nations, but doesn't join in with the vices of white men.

### ***Speaks with Nations***

***Young Indian wise woman***

Despite her youth, Speaks With Nations is the local Cherokee wise woman, holding much of the tribe's secret knowledge as well as having her own healing skills. She is expected to be the main Cherokee representative in the forthcoming treaty negotiations

### ***Spotted Horse***

***Indian gunslinger***

Although the son of the local Cherokee chief, Spotted Horse has adopted many of the white man's ways. He uses six-guns rather than bow and arrows and is a capable gunfighter. However he also claims his Indian spirit vest protects him from bullets.

## **The Cowboy Gang**

### ***'Curly' Bill Brocius***

***Leader of the Cowboy gang***

Curly Bill is the leader of the notorious Cowboy Gang. More than a hundred in number, and easily recognised by their red sashes, they moved their activities to Tombstone about six months ago and are a threatening presence in the town and the territory around it. The Cowboys are rustlers, bullies and thieves but there are so many of them they've not yet been challenged. Curly Bill is an unstable and deadly man, even without the Cowboys behind him.

### ***Ike Clanton***

***Ranch foreman and Cowboy lieutenant***

A tough cowboy and poker player with experience of killing dating back to the Civil War, Ike Clanton is one of Curly Bill's lieutenants. Clanton arrived in town about six months ago and became foreman on the Chisum ranch soon afterwards. He joined the Cowboy gang not long after that, when they arrived in the area.

### ***Sherman McMasters***

***Ranch foreman and Cowboy lieutenant***

McMasters fought for the Union army during the War. He came to Tombstone three years ago, taking up a post as foreman of the Drummond ranch. He's been a capable and loyal foreman for Jessica Drummond since then, helping her through difficult times such as the death of her daughter Rebecca Drummond. McMasters joined the Cowboy Gang not long after they came to town.

### ***Billy 'the Kid'***

***Notorious gunslinger and Cowboy lieutenant***

This young man claims to be the legendary young gunslinger William Bonney supposedly killed by Pat Garrett five years ago. He's certainly quick to show his fast draw – and nobody has yet been brave enough to face him down. Billy is one of the Curly Bill's main enforcers and lieutenants.

### ***Johnny Ringo***

***Educated gunfighter and Cowboy lieutenant***

Although only in his mid-twenties, Johnny Ringo has had a reputation as a deadly gun, and cold-blooded killer for the past seven or eight years. He's also acquired quite an education somewhere, able to speak Latin and quote Shakespeare. Ringo is one of the main reasons few people are prepared to stand up to Curly Bill's gang.

## **Recent arrivals in town**

### ***Angel 'Eyes' Sentenza***

### ***Bounty hunter and gambler***

Angel 'Eyes' is a card-player and gunman who was last here six years ago when he was found guilty of killing old man Drummond, husband to Jessica and father of Brock. As it wasn't a clear-cut murder, Judge Roy Bean sentenced Angel to five years' hard labour in Tucson for the crime. Angel rode back into Tombstone a few days ago, alongside Malachi Johnson.

### ***Malachi Johnson***

### ***Recently arrived rancher***

Malachi Johnson, apparently Rae Johnson's brother, rode into town a few days ago with Angel Sentenza. He fought for the Union Army during the War and has worked in Washington since then. He came to Tombstone expecting to meet his parents, but instead found them dead.

### ***Joshua Smith***

### ***Bank Manager***

Joshua Smith was given the job of manager of Murphy's Bank not long after Alexander Mitchell, the last bank manager, disappeared. Smith is a banker from back East who has come out West to see more of the world and maybe make his fortune.

### ***Calvin 'Slick' Sandhope***

### ***Southern Gambler***

Slick is a southern gambler who's been in Tombstone for the last few days sizing up the card tables and enjoying the company of the saloon girls. He's here for the Poker Championship and is certain to be one of the favourites.

### ***Deputy Tom Destry Jr***

### ***New town deputy***

Young Destry arrived in town last week to take up the post of deputy to newly-appointed Sheriff Washington Dimsdale. Deputy Destry is the son of the legendary Tom Destry Senior, the man who single-handedly cleaned up Deadwood in the mid 60s. If Tom is as fair and as skilled with a gun as his father then lawbreakers in Tombstone have plenty to fear.

### ***'Doc' John Holliday***

### ***Notorious educated gunfighter***

Doc Holliday is a dentist from out East turned gambler and feared gunfighter - one of the most notorious killers in the West. Holliday has been in town for a few weeks with his girl Rio Kate. They're here for the Poker Championship, but it's probably not a coincidence that Doc's unlikely friends the Earp brothers have recently arrived in Tombstone themselves.

### ***'Rio' Kate Johansen***

### ***Visiting bar girl and gambler***

Rio Kate is a saloon girl, poker player and usual companion of Doc Holliday. Like the Doc, Kate is undoubtedly in town for the poker tournament. Kate is supposed to be a capable gun herself who has helped her lover out of a few tight spots.

### ***Frank James***

### ***Railroad trouble-shooter***

This tough, cold-eyed gunslinger arrived in town a few weeks ago and works for Gabriel Morton, helping him buy the land needed by the railroad. There's a rumour that this is the infamous Frank James himself, who along with his brother Jesse led the notorious James gang a few years back.

### ***Gabriel Morton***

### ***Wealthy railroad baron***

An extremely wealthy invalid, who needs crutches to get around, Morton owns and operates the Morton Railroad Company. He's personally leading the drive to complete the first coast-to-coast railroad line. Morton is based at the railhead just outside of town in his luxury personal train but is often in one or other of the saloons, usually with Frank James at his side.

**Wyatt Earp**

***Retired lawman and shopkeeper***

Wyatt Earp, a living legend as a lawman for cleaning up Dodge City, has retired and moved to Tombstone to make his fortune. He's run his own store, Earp's Emporium, in competition with Murphy's General Store, for the past few months.

**Virgil Earp**

***Retired lawman and Tunstall ranch foreman***

Virgil Earp is the oldest of the Earp brothers. As a lawman, he helped his brother Wyatt clean up Dodge City. Virgil left the law and came to Tombstone to set up as a rancher about six months ago. Unfortunately, rustlers stole his cattle and killed younger brother James Earp. Virgil blamed Ike Clanton and his father for the killing and, some think, was himself later responsible for Pa Clanton's death. Virgil now works as foreman on the Tunstall Ranch.

**Thaddeus Jones**

***Last Chance Saloon Faro dealer***

Thaddeus Jones has worked for the past couple of weeks as the Faro dealer at the Last Chance saloon. He's a friendly, charming man who seems to run a straight game.

**John Paden**

***Noted civil war veteran***

John Paden is a hero of the Union Army in the Civil War and the only Union survivor of the notorious Cloudy Peak Massacre perpetrated by the outlaw Josey Wales. Paden's book about his war experiences was a best-seller. It was notable for his vow in the preface to hunt down and kill Josey Wales, the man who murdered Paden's troops. Paden has been in town for the past couple of months, working behind the bar at The Oriental saloon.

**'Preacher'**

***Visiting preacher***

The preacher, recognisable as such by his dog collar, has been working as a ranch hand for Jill McBain for about the past month. He doesn't speak much, and nobody seems to know his name.

## **Only just arrived in town**

**Adelaid Adams**

***Famous actress and entertainer***

This famous New York actress and entertainer has just arrived on the train with Calamity Jane. She must be here to perform at one of the saloons, or maybe at the County Fair. There's also a rumour going round that she's engaged to one of the Earp brothers.

**Annabelle Bransford**

***Charming Southern gambler***

Mrs Annabelle Bransford is a lovely young lady from the south who has just arrived on the last stagecoach. She's believed to be in town for the Poker Championship.

**Annie Oakley**

***Famous sharpshooter***

The famous sharpshooter Annie Oakley arrived in town about a week ago. She's supposed to be the fastest and most accurate woman in the West with six-gun or rifle, and more than a match for all but a very few men.

**Bret Maverick**

***Amiable gambler***

A gentleman and highly regarded card player, young Bret Maverick arrived on the last stagecoach. He's here in town for the Poker Championship and is one of the favourites to win it.

**'Buffalo' Bill Cody**

***Famous hunter and cavalryman***

Buffalo Bill is probably the most famous character in the West and his name is a legend from San Francisco to New York. He's been a cavalryman, a gambler, a rider and a hunter. He's just ridden into town, presumably to play in the Poker Tournament.

***Charlie Malloy***

***Miracle cure salesman***

Charlie Malloy is a salesman, here to demonstrate and sell modern medicines and cure-alls. He's from the South by his accent, but has brought his miracle cures fresh from Paris, London and New York. Malloy rode in with his cart of goods a few days ago.

***Ellen Harmon***

***Driven gunslinger***

This mysterious young woman arrived on the last stagecoach. She's dressed in men's clothes and wears a six-gun on her hip as if she knows how to use it. Nobody seems to know where she's from or why she's in town.

***Jim McKay***

***Eastern sea captain***

Jim McKay is, by all accounts, a regular ship's captain from Baltimore. He's just arrived on the train to marry his fiancée Patricia Terrill. They got engaged while she was out East this past winter and spring. The big country must be strange for him after a life on the ocean, but the wedding – set for Sunday morning – should be a grand affair.

***Sister Sara Inviolata***

***Visiting Nun***

Sister Sara is a young nun who rode her mule into Tombstone this morning alongside Pat Garrett. It isn't known what Church business has brought her through dangerous territory into town.

***Marshal Sierra Jones***

***Young US Marshall***

The first ever female US Marshal, Sierra Jones has quickly made a name for herself as more than a mere curiosity. Whatever has brought her to Tombstone, she's certainly working fast. She only arrived on this morning's train and is already rumoured to have arrested one of the Earp brothers for murder.

***Josephine Marcus***

***Travelling actress***

Josephine Marcus has her own theatrical troupe and has been hired by Frenchy to perform at the Last Chance saloon on Friday night. Unfortunately, most of the troupe turned back when their stage was attacked by bandits a couple of towns back.

***Romulus Fabian***

***Travelling actor***

Romulus Fabian is a noted Shakespearean actor who has joined Josephine Marcus' theatrical troupe. It will be interesting to see what his refined English sensibilities make of a place like Tombstone.

***Mary Margaret***

***Enthusiastic missionary***

Mary Margaret is one of the two leaders of the Temperance group here in Tombstone to build a church. Although the youngest of the two, in her early twenties, Mary Margaret seems to be the driving force behind the project. Mary Margaret rode into town two days ago with the group and their wagons.

***Margaret Mary***

***Experienced missionary***

Margaret Mary is the other leader of the Temperance group, here in Tombstone to build a church. Margaret Mary is the more experienced missionary, but tends to defer to her companion Mary Margaret. She arrived in town on this morning's train.

***Marshal Rooster Cogburn***

***Famed US Marshall***

Rooster Cogburn has been a famous lawman for nearly thirty years. His eye-patch makes him almost instantly recognisable and strikes fear into the hearts of many outlaws. They know that, once he's on their tail, he's got the grit to never give up the chase. Cogburn is in town to referee Mayor Murphy's grand poker tournament.

***Pat Garrett***

***Famous lawman turned bounty-hunter***

Pat Garrett was the US Marshal who, five years ago, tracked down and killed the outlaw Billy the Kid. Not long after that, he apparently talked Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid out of robbing a bank in Dallas, without drawing a gun. Now he's retired as a lawman and instead earns a better living as a bounty hunter, collecting the rewards on the outlaws he's captured or killed. Garrett rode into town earlier alongside the nun Sister Sara.

## **Other notable individuals who aren't around**

### ***Frank J. Cooper***

***Arizona Territory Governor***

The Republican governor of the Arizona Territory Frank J. Cooper is married to Hezekiah Beckum's sister. He has removed the status of territory capital from the city of Prescott, although he still lives there for now, after the Prescott Rodeo resulted in two saloons and the schoolhouse being burnt to the ground. He's due to appoint another Territory capital sometime soon and then lead the fight for statehood from there.

### ***Bat Masterton***

***Lawman and gambler***

Wyatt Earp's old deputy back in Dodge City was the Faro dealer at the Last Chance saloon here in Tombstone until a few weeks ago. He went to Trinidad, Colorado where he'd been offered the job of sheriff.

### ***Belle Star***

***Outlaw***

Famed as 'the Bandit Queen', Belle Star is the most wanted woman in the West. She has belonged in her time to both the James Gang and the Hole in the Wall Gang. She's wanted in several states and territories for crimes including robbery, extortion and murder.

### ***Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid***

***Outlaws***

Butch and Sundance lead the Hole in the Wall Gang, famous for its train robberies and other exploits – not least that nobody has ever died during one of the gang's hold ups. Nothing has been heard of either of them for nearly a year, although there are rumours they've died, or travelled to New York or even South America.

### ***Jesse and Frank James***

***Outlaws***

The James brothers led the notorious and violent James Gang a few years back. They dropped out of sight after a bloody bank robbery in San Antonio that left nearly a dozen dead, including half their gang. They got away with more than \$5,000 in gold from this so maybe they retired quietly somewhere.

### ***John Dunbar***

***Cavalry officer and Indian friend***

Cavalry officer formerly of Fort Huachuca, he was transferred to a remote outpost in the Dakota Territory. Rumour has it that he befriended the local Lakota Indians and became known as "Dances With Wolves". He left his post to live with his adopted tribe, and has been infrequently heard of since.

### ***Josey Wales***

***Outlaw***

Josey Wales was the Southern Renegade responsible for the Massacre at Cloudy Peak that happened near the end of the Civil War. He's been an outlaw with a high price on his head ever since then, with his many crimes well-documented in John Paden's famous book. Little has been heard of Wales for years.

### ***Pike Bishop***

***Outlaw***

The outlaw Pike Bishop used to lead the gang called the Wild Bunch until about six years ago. That was when they were ambushed during a bank robbery in Phoenix. Bishop and a couple of other gang members shot their way out using a Temperance parade as cover, leaving more than twenty dead including women and children. Nothing has been heard of him since.

### ***Angelina***

***Ruthless bounty hunter***

Some call Angelina a bounty hunter, some an assassin. Her reputation is as a ruthless killer and lightning-fast gunfighter who kills for cash – whether a bounty paid by the law or a fee fixed in a less official transaction. Those who claim to have met her say she is beautiful.

### ***Sitting Bull***

***Indomitable Indian Chief***

Sitting Bull is a Lakota chief and holy man whose courage is legendary in the West. He led a combined force of Lakota and Cheyenne to defeat General George Armstrong Custer at Little Big Horn. After this, he led his tribe over the border to Canada beyond the reach of the U S Army. He has recently been reported as having returned to Montana.

***Tom Horn***

***Legendary Indian Scout***

The legendary cavalryman and Indian scout Tom Horn is said to be the greatest tracker in the West. He's now a freelance bounty hunter although he is rumoured to be in the sometime employ of the Pinkerton Agency. Horn was last heard of in Texas.

**Some characters who are not in the game at all**

***'Doc' Emmett Brown***

***Scientist and blacksmith***
